


## **Unwrapping the Secret to Talking About Holiday Finances**

The study collected responses via an online survey of 644 individuals in November of 2006. Margin of error is approximately 3%.

1. Does your family tend to overspend during the holiday season?




2. Think of the person in your family who is most likely to overspend during the holidays. Why do you think they overspend?

They feel pressure to buy a gift they can't really afford.

They aren't very good with budgets in general. The problem is just more obvious around the holidays.	
They are impulse shoppers. They haven't planned out their purchases in advance.	
They love to shop.	
They use holiday gifts to make up for past sins like not spending enough time with the person, not remembering their birthday, or something worse.	_
They feel locked into holiday gift-giving traditions they don't want to break.




6. Think of the toughest discussion you've had with a family member about overspending during the holidays. How well did this discussion go?
